## CIRCULAR

### Subject: Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS) Campaign 2025 and Minimizing Pendency

The Government of India has announced the launch of the Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS) Campaign 2025 and Minimizing Pendency across all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in India. This campaign will be held in Apollo Knowledge City from September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025 to October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2025, in alignment with our national vision for a clean and efficient governance system.

The UGC, in its letter dated September 11, 2025, has directed all HEIs to appoint Nodal Officers for this campaign. These officers will be responsible for daily progress reviews on cleanliness drives and must upload details of activities conducted at their institutions on the UGC University Activity Monitoring Portal at <https://swachhatahiseva.gov.in>.

As we did last year, The Apollo University (TAU) will once again take the lead in organizing the activities outlined by the UGC, under the leadership of the NSS Units of Apollo Knowledge City (AKC). Please find attached the schedule of activities and the list of Nodal Officers, along with the executive committee and their responsibilities.

You are kindly requested to direct the assigned staff to attend their duties on the specified days and permit them to identify students for the listed activities. Additionally, please instruct faculty to record attendance for participating students based on the recommendations of the concerned faculty in charge of the executive committee.

## Students Lead Environmental Action in Swachha Andhra Plantation Drive

**The Apollo University's NSS Units 1 & 2, along with the Eco Club,** organized the

Swachha Andhra Plantation Drive 2025 on 20<sup>th</sup> September at Vividha Garden under the Swachhata Hi Seva campaign. A total of 70 saplings—including Pomegranate, Sapota, Papaya, Guava, and Tulsi—were planted to enhance the campus green cover and promote sustainable, eco-friendly practices. The event was inaugurated by Registrar Prof. M. Potharaju, who encouraged students to actively participate in creating a greener campus.

Aligned with the Government of India's Ministry of Youth Affairs, the campus continues to celebrate its month-long Swachhata Campaign each year, expanding tree varieties, strengthening NSS-Eco Club collaboration, and reinforcing its commitment to a greener, cleaner, and more sustainable campus.

**Venue:** Vividha Block

As part of the Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign 2025, Apollo Knowledge City carried out a focused Plantation Drive on 27<sup>th</sup> September at Vividha – the Student Affairs Block. Led by the NSS Unit and the Eco Club, the activity formed part of the larger campus-wide environmental initiative held from 23rd September to 4th October.

A total of 30 saplings—10 Coconut, 10 Musambi, and 10 Lemon—were planted to promote ecological balance, enhance the green cover, and transform Vividha into a space for flower and fruit-bearing plants. Registrar Prof. M. Potharaju inaugurated the event and encouraged students to integrate environmental responsibility into campus life.

**Massive Plantation Drive** (Nearly 1000 plants from the forest department)

A Massive Plantation Drive was organized in collaboration with the Forest Department, during which nearly 1,000 saplings were planted across the campus to enhance green cover and promote environmental sustainability. The activity was conducted under the supervision of the DGM – Facilities, along with the Hostel Faculty Coordinators (FCs), Dr. Hemanth Reddy of AIMSR, and Dr. Leelavathi of ACoN. The initiative marked a significant step toward creating a greener, healthier, and more eco-friendly campus environment.



## Hostel Cleanliness Drive

**Date:** 23 - 09 - 2025

**Venue:** Campus Hostels



A Hostel Cleanliness Drive was conducted from **24<sup>th</sup> September 2025 to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2025** at the campus Hostels with the objective of promoting hygiene and ensuring a healthy residential environment for students. The initiative focused on improving cleanliness standards and encouraging responsible living practices among hostel residents.

The drive was organized under the supervision of DGM Facilities, **Mr. Appurao**, along with the active coordination of the **Hostel Faculty Coordinators**. 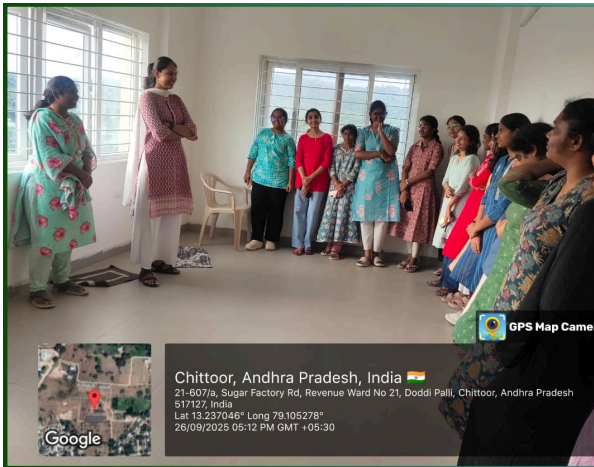

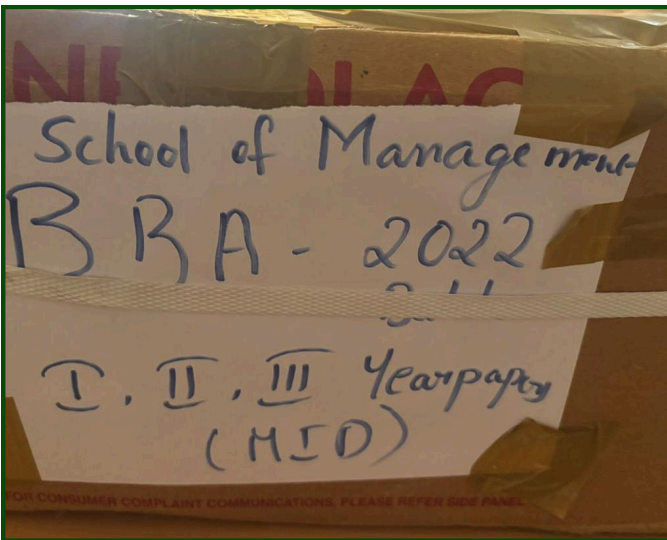

## EWYL Student Interns Lead Campus-Wide Digital Clean-Up

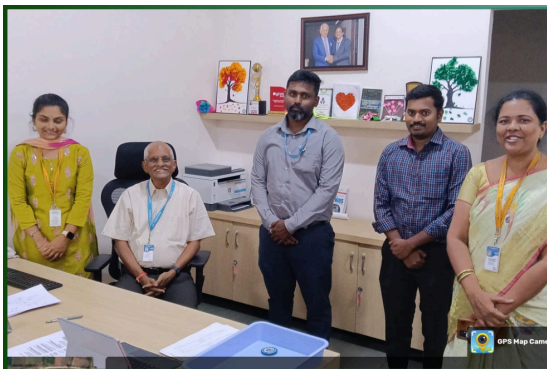
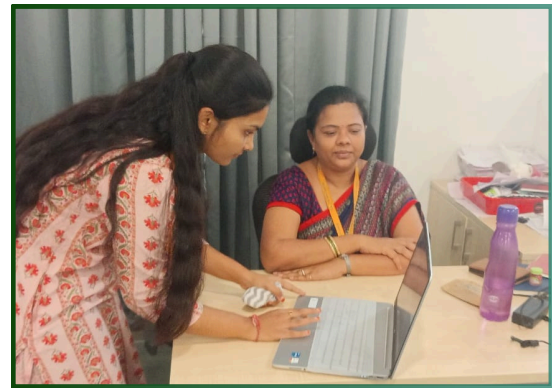
