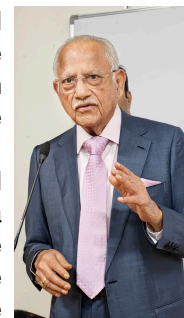

The session included case discussions on breast cancer awareness, focusing on symptoms, risk factors, and screening in women, as well as a rare case of hyperemesis gravidarum presenting with central nervous system manifestations.

The session focused on early recognition of cardiac arrest, CPR techniques, AED usage, and emergency response, with hands-on practice and return demonstrations enhancing students' practical skills and teamwork in life-saving situations.
