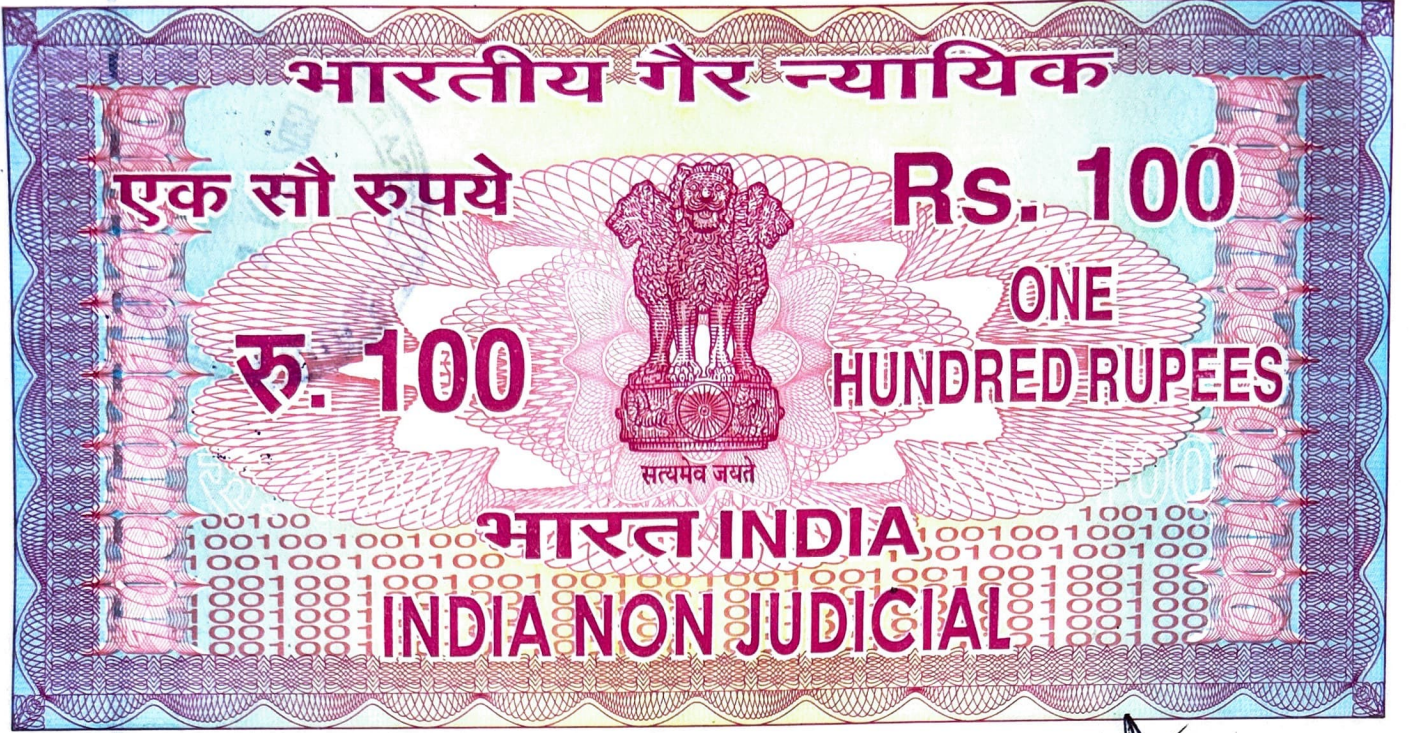

Memorandum of Agreement among NMDC Limited, The Apollo University & Apollo MedSkills Limited

This Memorandum of Agreement ("MoA") is made and executed on this 13th day of October, 2025, at Hyderabad, Telangana State, by and between:

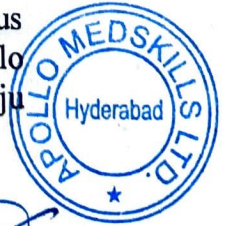
NMDC Limited ("NMDC"), A Navratna Public Sector Enterprise under the administrative control of the Ministry of Steel, Government of India, incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956, having its registered office at 10-3-311/A, Khanij Bhavan, Masab Tank, Hyderabad – 500028 (Telangana), hereinafter referred to as "NMDC" (which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, include its successors and assigns), represented by Shri P. Shyam, General Manager (IE) CSR, NMDC Ltd., of the First Part;

The Apollo University, established under the Andhra Pradesh Private Universities (Establishment & Regulation) Act, 2016, as notified vide Andhra Pradesh Gazette Notification No. 608/G593, dated 03-11-2021, having its campus at The Apollo Knowledge City, Saketa, Murukambattu Post, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh – 517127, offering undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral programs in various disciplines through its constituent schools, and being sponsored by the Apollo Hospitals Educational & Research Foundation, represented by Shri Potharaju Malasani, Registrar herein referred to as "TAU", (which expression shall, unless

Apollo MedSkills Limited ("AMSL"), A company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956/2013, having its registered office at 7-1-617/A, Imperial Towers, Ameerpet, Hyderabad – 500038, Telangana, engaged in healthcare skilling and training, hereinafter referred to as "AMSL" (which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context, include its successors and assigns), represented by Dr. Pulijala Srinivasa Rao, of the Third Part;

NMDC, TAU and AMSL are hereinafter individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

WHEREAS:

1. NMDC is committed to providing educational and livelihood opportunities to tribal students from Bastar and Dantewada districts of Chhattisgarh, under NMDC Limited's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives, with a particular focus on professional and technical education.
2. TAU has established itself as a centre of excellence in various health sciences programs, including Medical Technology courses, and possesses the necessary infrastructure, faculty, and clinical facilities required for delivering such programs.



3. NMDC has approached TAU to extend educational support in various **B.Sc. Allied Health programs** to 90 eligible tribal students (or such revised number as may be mutually agreed upon), from Bastar and Dantewada districts, from the Academic Year 2025-26.
4. NMDC has accordingly launched a **Livelihood Enhancement Program** under CSR for the sponsorship of students into the following B.Sc. Allied Health Courses offered by TAU having its campus at The Apollo Knowledge City, Saketa, Murukambattu Post, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh – 517127:
- B.Sc. Emergency Medical Technology – 15 seats
 - B.Sc. Medical Lab Technology – 15 seats
 - B.Sc. Anesthesiology & Operation Theatre Technology – 15 seats
 - B.Sc. Renal Dialysis Technology – 15 seats
 - B.Sc. Imaging Technology – 15 seats
 - B.Sc. Physician Assistant – 15 seats

NOW, THEREFORE, this MoA sets forth the understanding and agreement among the Parties as follows:

1. OBJECTIVE

To provide opportunities for professional education in Allied Health programs to eligible tribal youth of Bastar and Dantewada districts through full sponsorship under the CSR initiatives of NMDC Ltd., implemented by NMDC, academic facilitation by The Apollo University and Ensuring Placement by Apollo MedSkills Limited

2. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

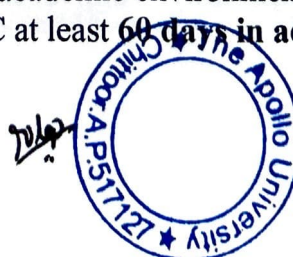
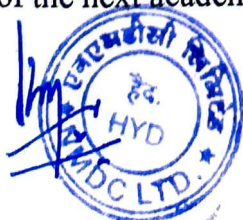
This MoA covers the admission, education, accommodation, Placement and support for 90 tribal students (or such revised number as mutually agreed) in the Allied Health programs having its campus by TAU at **The Apollo Knowledge City, Saketa, Murukambattu Post, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh – 517127 School of Health Sciences**) for the academic year 2025-26 and may be extended through mutual consent.



3. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A) ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY OF THE APOLLO UNIVERSITY (TAU):

1. Conduct admission test and/or evaluation for selection of eligible tribal students at locations facilitated by BIOM Bachel Project, NMDC Ltd., on mutually agreed dates.
2. Admit and impart education to the selected students in the six Allied Health Programmes having its campus at The Apollo Knowledge City, Saketa, Murukambattu Post, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh – 517127.
3. Provide safe, secure, and hygienic hostel accommodation with mess facilities to all admitted students.
4. Deliver structured education as per norms and syllabus prescribed by the appropriate authorities for the Allied Health Programmes listed above at TAU's Chittoor campus, as applicable.
5. Supply books, study materials, uniforms, and other essentials required for successful completion of the courses.
6. Maintain academic infrastructure, laboratories, equipment, and faculty as per regulatory standards.
7. Ensure course curricula and pedagogy comply with relevant norms set by regulatory authorities such as UGC, state authorities / or any other applicable regulatory bodies.
8. Arrange clinical training and internship as per course requirements.
9. Ensure anti-ragging compliance in accordance with UGC Regulations and Supreme Court directions.
10. Provide students with medical support for routine ailments at no cost through its on-campus hospital. Additionally, in-patient hospitalization expenses shall be covered up to ₹1,00,000 (one lakh) per student under a suitable group medical insurance policy, subject to the general terms and conditions applicable to such policies.
11. Submit student progress reports, exam results, and status of continuation/discontinuation to the NMDC on a semester basis. TAU reserves the right to take disciplinary or academic action against students in accordance with its internal policies and regulations. Such actions may be taken in cases of misconduct, chronic underperformance, or any other violations as determined by TAU. All disciplinary measures shall be implemented in a fair and transparent manner, ensuring due process.
12. Provide a cumulative fee statement within 10 working days of student joining.
13. Ensure 75% placement assistance (25% in Apollo Hospitals and 50% in other Hospitals) post course completion through Apollo MedSkills Limited.
14. Maintain a safe, inclusive, and conducive academic environment.
15. Submit annual fee proposals to the NMDC at least 60 days in advance of the start of the next academic year.



16. Charge fees for NMDC-sponsored students not exceeding the fees prescribed for Management/Non-sponsored quota students of similar courses.

B) ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY OF NMDC LIMITED (NMDC)

1. Facilitate mobilization and selection of eligible tribal students from Bastar and Dantewada districts, including arrangement of admission tests at designated venues in collaboration with TAU.
2. Fully sponsor the selected students' travel from Bastar and Dantewada districts to the designated institution, covering tuition, hostel, mess, books, insurance, uniforms, and other related charges, payable in a single installment annually, typically in the month of **September**. Ensure timely disbursement of funds to the designated institution. If disbursement of dues is delayed beyond sixty (60) days, TAU reserves the right to suspend non-academic services, including but not limited to the issuance of certificates and transcripts, until all outstanding payments are cleared. Such suspension shall remain in effect until the financial obligations are fulfilled in accordance with the applicable policies.
3. Cease sponsorship in the case of academic failure, drop-out, or voluntary discontinuation by students; however, fees for such students already paid to the Institute will not be refunded and shall be treated as utilized.
4. Review and approve revised fee structures proposed by TAU annually. Any fee increase resulting from regulatory revisions, inflation, or cost escalation, including but not limited to utilities, mess charges, and supplies, shall be reimbursed by NMDC upon submission of appropriate justification by TAU. Such justification shall include relevant supporting documentation and shall be subject to review and approval in accordance with applicable policies and agreements.
5. Clear bills raised by TAU for the academic year within **one month** of submission, subject to correctness and supporting documents.
6. Monitor the overall academic progress of sponsored students through reports received from the TAU and periodic reviews.
7. Address any concerns related to student welfare, academic performance, and funding.
8. In the event that NMDC is unable to fill all ninety (90) seats in any academic year, NMDC shall be permitted to fill available seats up to two (2) months following the commencement of the academic course. For the first year of the program, if the number of enrolled students is fewer than six (6), specifically less than eighty-four (84) students in total, NMDC shall not be liable to pay the program fees for the entire four-year duration. However, if the number of enrolled students exceeds the threshold of eighty-four (84) during the first year, NMDC shall be obligated to pay the applicable fees for the remaining years of the program. Effective from the subsequent academic



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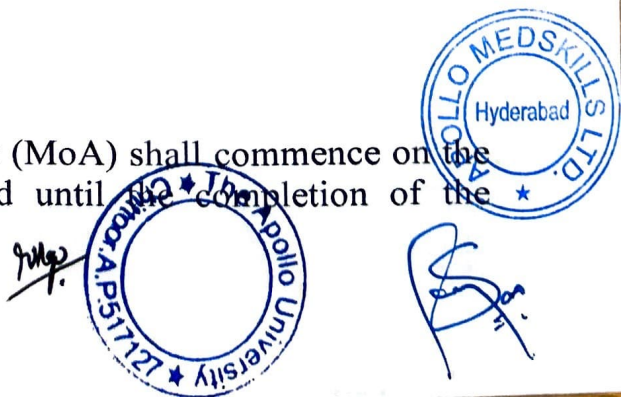
year, the minimum threshold for fee waiver eligibility shall be revised to five (5) students.. Furthermore, NMDC shall remain liable for payment of the remaining program fee attributable to any student who discontinues or withdraws from the program at any point prior to its completion.

C) ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY OF APOLLO MEDSKILLS LIMITED ("AMSL"):

- a. TAU shall ensure that a minimum of 75% of successfully certified trainees across all six Allied Health programs that are provided with placement opportunities 25% in Apollo Hospitals and 50% in Other Hospitals within six months of course completion through its Skilling and placement arm (Private Limited Company) Apollo Med Skills Limited, with which it has signed an MOU for the purpose of aiding placement to students educated by TAU. Placement shall be defined as confirmed employment in a relevant field, with valid documentation including offer letters or appointment orders submitted to NMDC for verification.
- b. In the event that TAU fails to meet the minimum 75% placement benchmark, the eligible fee payable shall be recalculated based on the following formula: Eligible Fee = (Actual Placement % / 75) × Total Fee. For example, if only 74% of successfully trained candidates are placed, then the eligible fee shall be: $(74 \div 75) \times \text{Total Fee} = 98.66\%$ of Total Fee. This difference amount shall be paid to NMDC Limited by Apollo Med Skills Limited to enable final payment by the NMDC to TAU. This amount shall be computed after excluding candidates who dropped out, failed to meet academic requirements, or were declared medically unfit or unwilling to pursue job (going for entrepreneurship) etc—subject to documentary evidence and mutual agreement between the parties.
- c. The final placement data, including documentation, shall be submitted to NMDC within 30 days of completion of the placement period, and the final settlement shall be made accordingly.

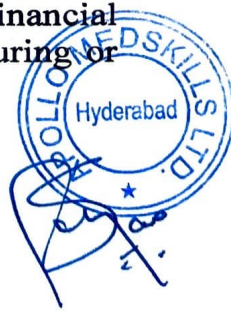
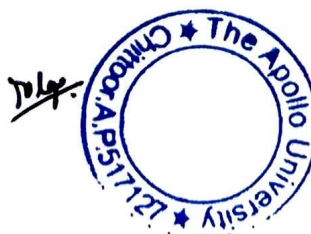
D) OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a. This Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) shall commence on the Effective Date and remain valid until the completion of the



academic course that begins in the academic year 2025–26. For each new academic batch admitted to the program, a separate agreement shall be executed between the parties. Such agreement shall remain valid until the completion of the course for that specific batch and shall govern all terms and obligations applicable to that cohort.

- b. Either Party may terminate this MoA with six months' prior written notice, provided such notice is given before the start of the next academic year (i.e., before February). However, both Parties shall continue to fulfill their commitments towards students already admitted under the scheme until the completion of their respective courses.
- c. No amendment, modification, or alteration of this MoA shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by both NMDC and TAU. All such amendments shall be treated as addenda and become part of the main Agreement. Verbal or informal understandings shall not be binding unless ratified through formal exchange of letters by authorized signatories.
- d. TAU shall establish a structured monitoring framework to track the academic progress, placement status, and well-being of candidates trained under this program. A Joint Review Committee comprising representatives from NMDC and TAU shall meet on a periodic basis to evaluate the progress and address challenges, if any. NMDC reserves the right to conduct surprise inspections or third-party impact assessments at any time during the program.
- e. All communication, banners, certificates, promotional material, and event backdrops related to the program must carry NMDC's logo and mention sponsorship as "Supported by NMDC Limited under CSR Initiative." TAU shall ensure that all media coverage, social media posts, and institutional communications related to the program acknowledge NMDC's support prominently. NMDC shall be provided advance notice of major student events, graduation ceremonies, or placement drives for representation and branding purposes.
- f. NMDC reserves the right to conduct internal audits, financial inspections, or request a third-party audit at any point during or after the project duration.



4. FUNDING AND DISBURSEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

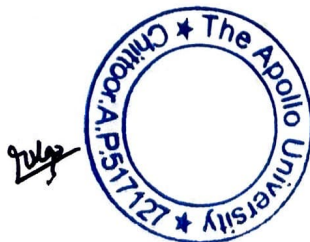
NMDC shall disburse the required funding in accordance with the clause 3(B)(2) and the year wise schedule agreed upon by the Parties as detailed in Annexure A.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY

Each Party agrees to keep all non-public information received from the other ("Confidential Information") strictly confidential and use it solely for the purposes of this MoA. Confidential Information shall only be disclosed to employees or agents on a need-to-know basis, provided they are bound by similar confidentiality obligations. This clause does not apply to information that is publicly available, already known, lawfully received from a third party, or independently developed. If disclosure is required by law, the affected Party will notify the other promptly. These obligations survive for three (3) years following the termination of this MoA.

6. DATA PRIVACY

Both the parties acknowledge that the collection, processing, storage, and sharing of personal data during the collaboration must comply with applicable data protection laws, including the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023 (DPDP Act) and relevant provisions of the Information Technology Act, 2000 (IT Act). Each party shall ensure that if personal data exchanged under this MoA, it will be processed lawfully, with explicit consent when required, and is used solely for the intended academic and research purposes. Both parties shall implement reasonable security measures to safeguard personal data against unauthorized access, loss, or misuse, in accordance with the IT Act and other applicable legal standards. Any personal data shared under this collaboration shall not be transferred outside India unless permitted under applicable data protection regulations. In the event of a data breach, each party shall promptly notify the other and take necessary corrective measures. This Data Privacy Clause shall survive the termination or expiry of this MoA.



7. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

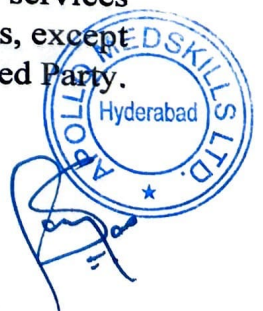
The Intellectual Property owned by the Parties before, during and after the subsistence of this Agreement shall remain their own properties and no infringement shall be caused to the same owing to the existence of this Agreement between the Parties. All intellectual property rights of TAU including, but not limited to, curricula, methodologies, research, and educational content shall remain exclusively with the TAU. NMDC acknowledges that all of the TAU's curricula, methodologies, educational modules, and related materials are and shall remain the exclusive property of the TAU. Unauthorized use, reproduction, or disclosure of such intellectual property is strictly prohibited, and the aggrieved party reserves the right to enforce its rights through legal action, including seeking damages and injunctive relief.

8. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

Each party represents and warrants that it has the full legal authority, rights, and capacity to enter into and perform this MoA, and that its execution, delivery, and performance do not violate any applicable laws, regulations, or contractual obligations. Both parties further warrant that all information, materials, and intellectual property provided under this MoA are free from third-party claims or encumbrances. Each party shall comply with all applicable laws and industry standards in fulfilling its obligations, and neither party makes any warranties beyond those expressly stated herein. Any implied warranties are hereby disclaimed to the fullest extent permitted by law.

9. INDEMNITY

Each party (the "Indemnifying Party") agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the other party, its affiliates, assignees, and each of its directors, officers, partners, employees, and agents (collectively, the ("Indemnified Parties")) from and against any and all suits, liabilities, claims, and proceedings by third parties, as well as any resulting liabilities, damages, costs, losses, and expenses, including court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of the performance or non-performance of the services contemplated under this MoA, or out of a breach of any of its terms, except in cases of gross negligence or wilful misconduct by the Indemnified Party.



10. ADVERTISEMENT AND PUBLICITY:

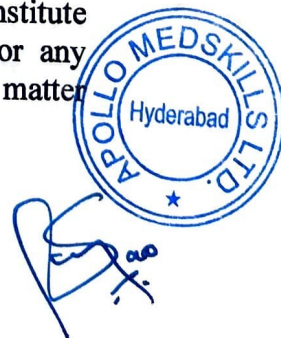
The parties agree that either of them shall use the other Party's Logo or any trademarks either register or unregistered for their branding or hosting in any electronic means or social media or websites or any other material without the prior written consent of the respective party.

11. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION:

This MOA shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India and the Parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Hyderabad.

12. DISPUTE RESOLUTION:

1. Any disputes or the differences including those considered as such by only one of the parties arising out of or in connection with the MoA shall be to the extent possible settled amicably between the parties. If amicable settlement cannot be reached then all the disputed issues shall be settled by Arbitration as provided in clauses below.
2. Any dispute or claim arising out of or relating to this MoA shall be finally settled by arbitration in accordance with the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (as amended). Initially, the Parties shall endeavour to mutually appoint a sole arbitrator to conduct the arbitration proceedings. If the Parties are unable to mutually appoint a sole arbitrator within thirty (30) days of initiating the arbitration process, then each Party shall nominate one arbitrator, and those two arbitrators shall jointly appoint a third arbitrator. The three arbitrators will together form the arbitration panel, which will serve as the tribunal to resolve the dispute.
3. All hearings shall be held in Hyderabad and conducted in English. This MoA shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India. Subject to arbitration, any unresolved dispute shall be exclusively adjudicated by the courts of Hyderabad. The arbitral award shall be final and binding on both Parties. Unless otherwise determined by the arbitrator, all fees and expenses incurred in connection with the arbitration shall be equally shared by the parties. Should the arbitrator's final award specify an alternative allocation, such awarded fees and expenses shall be borne by the non-prevailing party.
4. The parties shall continue to perform their obligations under this MoA during the Arbitration proceedings. No payment due to or payable by the Institute shall be withheld or delayed as regards any particular obligation or any particular payment which itself is or forms a direct part of the subject matter of the Arbitration proceedings.



13. NOTICES:

Any notice, demand, or request with respect to this MOA shall be in writing and shall be effective only if it is delivered by personal service, by air courier or emailed to the address set forth below:

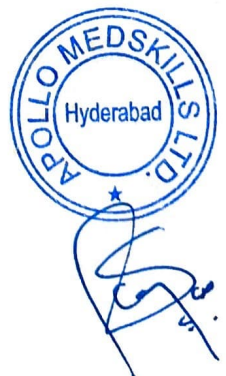
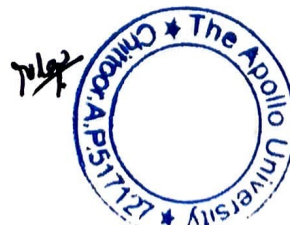

14. AMENDMENT:

Any amendment or variation of the terms of this MoA shall be valid only if mutually agreed upon and executed in writing by or on behalf of both the Parties.

15. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES:

The Parties are independent contractors for the purpose of this MoA. Neither the execution, delivery nor performance of this MoA will be construed to constitute either Party as an agent or representative of the other for any purpose. Neither the execution, delivery nor performance of this MoA will be deemed to establish a joint venture or partnership between the Parties. Except as otherwise provided herein, neither Party has the authority to (i) bind the other Party by or to any contract, representation, understanding, act or deed, (ii) represent that either Party is an agent of the other Party, or (iii) represent that either Party is responsible for the acts or omissions of the other Party.



16. SEVERABILITY:

If any provision, covenant or condition of this MoA is held by a court or regulatory body of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the rest of the MoA shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired or invalidated unless the removal of that provision results in a material change to the MoA.

17. NON- EXCLUSIVITY:

The Parties agree and acknowledge that this MoA is non-exclusive in nature and each Party is free and at liberty, to enter similar arrangements with other third-party entities for the same or related services.

18. FORCE MAJEURE:

1. Neither Party shall be liable for any failure to fulfill its obligations within the stipulated time, hereunder due to acts of God, wars, riots, landslides, earthquakes, fire, floods, pandemic, endemic, etc. which necessitates extraordinary measures or expense to maintain operations, strikes, go slows, lock outs/lock downs or disorder, any actions/interruptions by government, compliance with any court or administrative order, law, statute, ordinance or regulation, or other similar causes beyond its reasonable control. The Party unaffected by Force Majeure shall have the option to terminate this MoA, if the event of Force Majeure exceeds a period of thirty (30) days; upon due notice to the affected Party as provided in the termination clause.
2. Notwithstanding any Force Majeure occurrence or termination rights under this MoA, ongoing student education shall not be disrupted, and all payment obligations by NMDC hereunder shall continue to be met. In the event that conventional classroom instruction is disrupted or suspended due to Force Majeure circumstances, the Parties agree to ensure the continuity of education through an alternate mode of learning via online platforms. To facilitate this, NMDC shall supply the necessary interNMDC-enabled digital devices ("Digital Gadgets") to the sponsored students as deemed appropriate by TAU. Alternatively, if NMDC requests that TAU provide the required Digital Gadgets, NMDC shall reimburse TAU for such costs within thirty (30) days of the arrangement or upon receipt of invoice. All details regarding the implementation of these alternate learning arrangements, including the delivery and reimbursement mechanisms for Digital Gadgets, shall be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties.



19.NO WAIVER

No failure or delay by either Party in exercising any right, power, or remedy under this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of such right, power, or remedy. Likewise, any single or partial exercise of any right, power, or remedy shall not preclude or restrict any further or additional exercise of the same or any other right, power, or remedy.

20. ENTIRE MOA:

The Parties acknowledge and agree that this MOA including the Annexures attached hereto, constitute the complete and entire statement of all terms, conditions and representations of the MOA with regard to the subject matter hereof and it supersedes all prior understandings whether oral or written between the Parties. In the event that the Parties desire to change, add, or otherwise modify any terms, they shall do so in writing, and will be signed by both parties.

21. COUNTER PARTS

This MoA is being executed in two counterparts, each of which shall be deemed as original and both shall be a separate document but shall be taken together and deemed to be one and the same instrument.

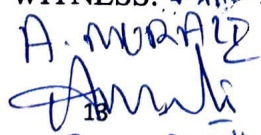
